

Clarification for Licensees

There was an error on the renewal forms that was only discovered after they were mailed. Proof of employment is **only required** if you are practicing in one of the 6 primary modalities (nuclear medicine, radiation therapy, radiography, radiologist assistant, sonography, or magnetic resonance imaging) for at least 3 of 5 years before 1/1/2017 **without a current appropriate registry**.

Primary Modalities: You are required to be registered or CE compliant only in those modalities you are currently practicing. You do not need to be registered in all 6, only the ones you are currently practicing. You may become licensed in a primary modality, even if you are not registered, if you have been practicing for at least 3 of 5 years before 1/1/2017. As mentioned above, you will need to have proof of employment for this. For national registries (ARRT, NMTCB, ARDMS, etc.) you currently have, you are required to obtain CE to maintain that registry. The NDMIRTB is not requiring any additional hours for those primary modalities as CE compliance is already a requirement of national registry renewal.

CE-compliant modalities: These include cardiac-interventional technology, computed tomography, mammography, quality management, vascular-interventional radiography technology, bone densitometry, or others as board approved. You will need to **begin earning CE hours during the 2020-2021 licensure cycle**; this will ensure you will be in CE compliance for the renewal cycle expiring 12/31/2021. The Admin Rule Draft states 5 CE hours for each of those which you practice but they can be the same hours you submit to registry. The hours will need to be within the Board's current **license cycle**, which will be 2020-2021 for the first cycle. These hours are not in addition to your registry hours. An example, if you have 5 CE hours related to CT, you may submit those to both your registry and the NDMIRTB; but it must be during biennial licensure cycle.

The Board has completed the Administrative Rules draft. There will be a public hearing coming up in November. You can keep updated on the Board's website, www.ndmirtboard.com, with the most recent draft and information about the public hearing.

*Individuals performing medical imaging in Cath Labs are ALL **required** to be licensed and obtain CE. Cardiovascular Invasive Specialists (CIS) and Cardiac Electrophysiology Specialists (CES) must be registered with Cardiovascular Credentialing International (CCI) or obtain an NDMIRTB Conditional License working toward their CCI registry.
